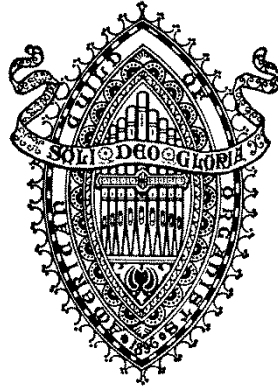

The Portland Chapter of the American Guild of Organists is pleased to offer scholarships to qualified applicants wishing to begin studying organ or progress further in their current organ performance studies.

GUIDELINES

- Scholarships available for private organ lessons.
- Previous piano study strongly recommended.
- Teacher must be qualified (i.e. of good reputation) and a member of the Portland, Oregon, Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (dual member is acceptable).
- Student must be a member of the Portland Chapter, or have a residential connection to the Portland area (reasonably extending into surrounding NW Oregon and SW Washington).
- Scholarships up to \$1000 per year are available. Applicants may reapply after one year for additional funding.
- Scholarship applications to be reviewed by the current Executive Board of the Portland Chapter AGO.
- If approved, monies will be forwarded to the teacher who will then give all lessons covered by said monies within a maximum of one year. The teacher will provide the student and Chapter with a statement of having received the scholarship money, and listing how many lessons are covered by it.
- Upon completion of study, a progress report may be requested by Portland Chapter AGO. Students will be invited to perform in a chapter recital.
- All members of the AGO are bound by the Guild Code of Ethics which includes the following non-discrimination policy: "Members of the American Guild of Organists do not discriminate against others on the basis of race, national origin, age, religious affiliation, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, disability, or medical condition".

The mission of the American Guild of Organists is to foster a thriving community of musicians who share their knowledge and inspire passion for the organ. The purposes of the American Guild of Organists are: ♦ To advance the cause of organ and choral music, to increase their contributions to aesthetic and religious experiences, and to promote their understanding, appreciation, and enjoyment. ♦ To improve the proficiency of organists and choral conductors. ♦ To evaluate, by examination, attainments in organ playing, choral techniques, conducting, and the theory and general knowledge of music, and to grant certificates to those who pass such examinations at specified levels of attainment. ♦ To provide members with opportunities to meet for discussion of professional topics, and to pursue such other activities as contribute to the fulfillment of the purposes of the Guild.
